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A MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT

Calling all new board member applicants! Are you interested in joining ASHE Harrisburg? In 2019, I took the leap and ran for the ASHE Board. At the time, I think there were around 12 highly qualified applicants and only 5 open positions for a 3-year term, but I was fortunate to be voted in by my peers. I remember the first few board meetings vividly, where I was just trying to understand what the Board did and how all the committees were organized. Now, I joke with incoming Board members that it will take you 3-years to understand the committees and then it will be time to retire from the Board.

These past few years, we have been making an effort to acclimate incoming Board members in the first couple of meetings, so they feel comfortable participating immediately. This has been accomplished by focusing less on the committees and more on what we do as well as meeting in person before the year starts. In my opinion, we have been very effective in executing our vision this year because of these changes.

If you remember, in the first newsletter we communicated our vision including a focus on events, young member participation, increasing membership, and engaging student chapters. This focus has led to a more equitable workload for Board members. We generally have approximately a one-hour meeting once a month and most Board members may spend about five hours per month contributing. Why did you join the ASHE Harrisburg Board of Directors and take on the role of President?

I joined ASHE around 1970. The Williamsport Section was very active. I was encouraged to join by Atwood Walker, ADE for Construction for the then Pennsylvania Department of Highways (PDH). Atwood was my mentor and president of the Williamsport Section at this time, and later became National President around 1976.

What did you personally and professionally gain from your ASHE Harrisburg membership and leadership experience?

I met other engineers and professionals who influenced me to participate on the various committees. In 1976 I became the Williamsport Section president. I accepted the opportunity to become a board member, vice-president and then president in 2008. My personal goal at this time was to attract more Central Office employees to join ASHE.

What are some of your favorite ASHE Harrisburg memories?

- I remember several ASHE picnics at the Lower Allen Township Building where we gambled our hearts away and never lost any money.
- Ron Springman, one of my closest friends in District 3, became national president of ASHE.
- I was totally surprised and honored to receive the Pearson Award as national member of the year at the National Convention in Baltimore in 2015.

What advice would you offer those just out of college/early in their careers?

I would encourage members should look for opportunities to mentor new members. I would encourage new members to join professional organizations to interact with other professionals in their field.

What are you up to these days?

I'm staying active in retirement. I exercise daily, play golf and pickleball, travel, read novels especially books about the old west. I still enjoy events with my family especially the grandchildren. Two grandchildren who participate in collegiate sports and two play golf, both of whom are better than I will ever be.
