ANNUAL ASHE HARRISBURG/PENNDOT ENGINEERING DISTRICT 8-0/PTC JOINT CONFERENCE – APRIL 17



The 19th Annual Joint Conference was held on April 29th at the Best Western Hotel in Harrisburg. There were approximately 266 people in attendance including 33 PennDOT District 8-0 staff, seven District 5-0 Staff and 33 PA Turnpike staff. The morning started off with ASHE Harrisburg President Kevin Scheurich providing opening remarks and inviting the group to attend the upcoming events and banquet. The first speaker was Brad Heigel, Chief Engineer of the PA Turnpike providing an overview of their upcoming program and a reminder that “Walls turned sideways are bridges.”

The second presentation of the morning was provided by Brent Barrett and Lindsey Ulizio of WRA regarding their project on Cayman Island addressing traffic and resiliency problems. Our lunch panel entitled “Engaging Next Gen” was hosted by ASHE 2nd VP, Danielle Derolf, and featured young staff from PennDOT, PA Turnpike and consultants. They shared their experiences and suggestions for proactively engaging younger staff and encouraging them to be involved with events outside the office.

The afternoon started off by our 1st VP, Virginia Bailey in a networking “Scavenger Hunt” to find people who could positively answer one of 30 questions like “Took the PE Exam in the last year.” After this exercise, PennDOT Executive Deputy Secretary Larry Shifflet took the podium and shared some higher level perspectives and noted some of the challenges related to funding and always striving for improving safety.

We rounded out the afternoon session with presentations from PennDOT District 8-0’s Kevin Keefe, Mike Reeder, and Ben Singer who discussed various aspects of their program the importance of work zone safety, construction accomplishments, and of course the upcoming construction and design contracts for the rest of 2025. 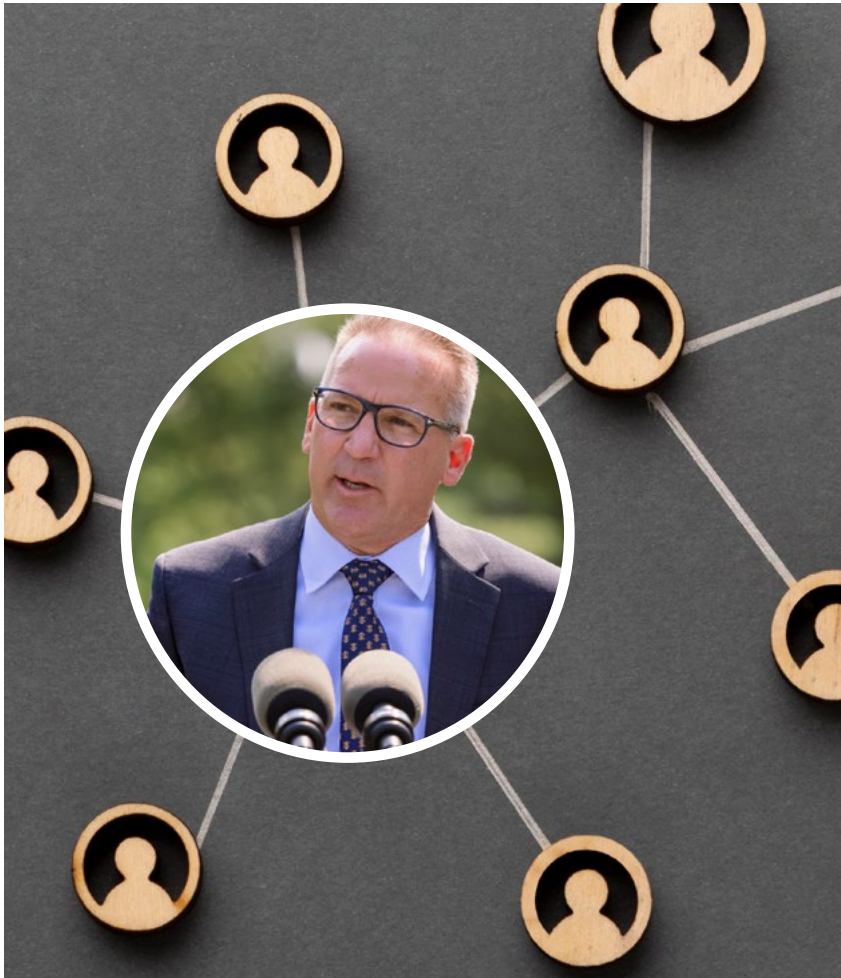
