PAST PRESIDENT'S CORNER

PRESIDENT

1990 – 1991

Why did you join the ASHE Harrisburg Board of Directors and take on the role of President?

I initially joined ASHE Harrisburg when I worked for PennDOT, District 8-0, around 1981. My ADE-Design was Bill Pickering, and he insisted that I join ASHE and become "The Profile" editor. My response was that I was not even a member nor had I attended any meetings, so how could I become "The Profile" editor. Bill said that he would introduce me to the current editor and that person would fill me in on my future duties. That happened, and I attended Board meetings every year that I was the editor and as an ASHE Officer. Eventually I became Secretary for several years then went through the officer ranks to become President for ASHE Harrisburg, 1990-91. I attended every ASHE dinner meeting during my tenure on the ASHE Board. In 1991-92, I was the immediate Past President and the next ASHE year I did not hold an office, yet I wasn't done with ASHE Harrisburg. Somewhere around that time, Ben Rocuskie approached me and invited me to finish his assignment as National Director for the remainder of his term representing ASHE Harrisburg/Altoona Zone 4.

I had accepted the position and at my first National Board Meeting I was told by the then National President that my assignment was as Managing Editor of "The SCANNER," our quarterly newsletter. The position was non-negotiable per the National President, so I took on the role of Managing Editor of

"The SCANNER." I remember meeting with the current editor, and the National Board wanted "The SCANNER" to look the same as it did before my involvement, even the font. Shortly thereafter, we used Wanner Associates from Harrisburg, PA to do the grunt work of pulling together "The Scanner." My job was to write a form letter which assigned certain sections to contribute to each edition of "The SCANNER," and to proofread each issue. I remained on the National Board for over 8 years holding positions such as, Managing Editor of The SCANNER, coordinator for the ASHE Display Booth, Long Range Plan Committee member, and finally I helped to develop the current National Organization. There were other duties as well.

What did you personally and professionally gain from your ASHE Harrisburg membership and leadership experience?

I met a lot of people who were in my profession. I also learned leadership styles and worked with high-level managers at PennDOT, and firm owners in my profession. I developed an understanding of what was important to these managers and owners, and I slowly climbed the ranks to the level of BOMO Bureau Director, at PennDOT, State Government. I was liked by these high-level managers and firm owners, which helped me to advance in my career. I also met many people outside of PennDOT who were integral to my career. All of this was very rewarding to me and my family.

What are some of your favorite ASHE Harrisburg memories?

Some of my favorite ASHE Harrisburg memories included attending the many ASHE Harrisburg dinner meetings and functions, naming our second child Ashley and giving her the nickname of Ashie while I was ASHE Harrisburg President, attending ASHE National Board Meetings and functions where I met many other members representing my career at the national level and, finally attending ASHE Altoona dinner meetings as their National Director, while representing ASHE Harrisburg/Altoona at the national level.

I also remember and had a favorite memory of creating the ASHE National Mission Statement, which is still in use today, which was accomplished at an ASHE National Strategic Planning Session. This was and continues to be one of my proudest moments. This Mission was very important to me!

What advice would you offer those just out of college/early in their careers?

I still remember one of my college professors saying that if you remain behind a drafting table and don't mix with your peers "no one will know who you are." I ended up behind a drafting table but remembered his statement. I got involved and truly had a great civil engineering career. I recommend that other Civil Engineering graduates and those early in their careers join a similar organization to ASHE and become noticed by their higher-level peers. I also recommend that young civil engineers take and pass the P.E. exam to obtain the credential of Professional Engineer.

What are you up to these days (Employment position, travel, hobbies, etc.)?

I retired from PennDOT with nearly 34 years of service, and over another 12 years in my civil engineering field working for a consultant engineering company. In that position, I continued my involvement in many of the same activities that I worked on at PennDOT. Also, I am currently active on two Boards of Directors, being the PSU Harrisburg Civil Engineering Board and the Quittapahilla Audubon Society Board, in Lebanon County. I was also a member of the Navarro & Wright Consulting Engineers, Board of Directors.

I enjoy gardening work, hiking, bird watching, and traveling with my wife, Patti. I have two children, Brian and Ashley. Both are married, and they travel as well. Brian is a successful Civil Engineer, P.E. manager with 4 boys, our grandkids, and Ashley is the CEO of a successful internet sales company.

I enjoy retirement but still stay connected to my career. However, I have no plans on becoming employed again. I like to serve as a Mentor to civil engineering students who have not entered their formal careers yet.

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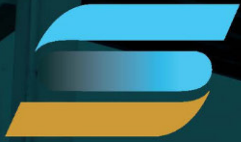
